## **Our Learning**

## **Nursery/Reception:**

The children have been busy learning about \* people who work at night and have enjoyed role playing different characters. The children will focus on healthy sleep routines this 🖈 coming week.

#### Acorns (Years 1-2):

In maths, Year 1 are working on place value within 20 and Year 2 are looking at money.

In literacy, we have begun a unit of work on traditional tales.

In science, we have started to look at seasonal changes.

We had a great trip to CPS on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> to a Dance Festival where we learnt a Dragon Dance for the Chinese New Year in February.

#### Lower Oaks (Years 3-4)

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We have started looking at "What a Waste". The children have been shocked and amazed about some of the facts we have found out.

In maths, we are learning new strategies for calculating multiplication and division. For this the children must be able to recall (i.e. 6 x 8 = 48 or at least skip count 8, 16, 24, 32, 40, 48 etc). Year 3 need to know their 2x, 3x 4x, 5x, 8x and 10x times tables and Year 4s need to know up to their 12x times tables with focus on 6x, 7x 8x and 9x times tables. The children have a multiplication check soon.

## **Upper Oaks (Years 5-6):**

In maths, we have been carrying on with our fraction learning. We have looked at how to add and subtract fractions.

In English, we have been writing our recount of our welly walk focusing on using interesting vocabulary.

#### OOSC - Out of School Club with Angie Lunn

The children in OOSC have been busy reinventing the role play area into a wand shop complete with a variety of colourful wands and potions.

Other craft projects include bracelet making as well as bag charms and keyrings. Outside the children have been using loose parts to create an obstacle course in the garden area which has been very popular with children of all ages.

## Animal Encounter – Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> February

On the morning of Tuesday 6th February, Animal Encounters will be coming into the school to provide several small workshops about different types of animals and how to look after them. Please note that for nursery children who are not usually in on that day, they can attend Toddler Group with their parent in the morning.



## **Cooking Club**

The PTFA have been looking into funding an After School Cooking Club on a Friday and this would require a small contribution, payable by parents. If you think this is something you would be interested in your child doing, then please let us know. If so, 6 sessions (1 hours 15 mins each) at £7:50 per week (including ingredients and cooked on site) will be payable to her direct – which will be two payments of £22.50.

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


