Our Learning

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Nursery/Reception:

We have all enjoyed our puddles and rainbow topic and will be finishing the topic next week with the book 'I can eat a rainbow'. We will be trying a range of fruits the colour of the rainbow that the children may not have tasted yet. We will also be doing some easter crafts and baking. Our topic next term is 'The big wide world'.

Acorns (Years 1-2):

The children have all worked incredibly hard this term and last week completed some 'challenge' papers. All the children have tried their best and have made good progress. We have enjoyed our science this term, learning about the seasons and how the sun controls the weather. We have investigated rain fall, the temperature and wind speed. In our topic work we have asked and answered our own questions, which you can see at the end of term celebration of learning on Thursday. Next term our topic will be 'Bright Lights, Big City'. In this topic we will be looking at London today and comparing it to London in the past when the Great Fire of London happened.

Lower Oaks (Years 3-4)

The Lower Oaks have been working on a text called 'Once upon a tune' by Mathew Mayhew which a beautiful text where the traditional stories are told through classical music. We have been looking carefully at what the music tells us about the characters and settings.

In Maths, we have been doing fractions looking at adding and subtracting them as

well as understanding how to order and compare them when they have the same numerator or denominator.

Homework is to get 1000 points per week on Mathletics in the alternate weeks to the topic homework that is being set.

Upper Oaks (Years 5-6):

In English, we have been looking at the story of the Pied Piper. We have been reading the story from the Mayor's point of view and planning our own versions of the story.

In Maths, we have been learning about decimal numbers. We have been practising some of our place value skills and applying them to decimals: this includes adding, subtracting, and rounding decimal numbers.

OOSC - Out of School Club with Angie Lunn

The children in OOSC have been enjoying writing their own spells and creating mystical potions in the mud kitchen. The bikes and scooters have been used for longer due to the lighter evenings with football and squash being played on the other half of the playground.

Please note that Hayley Howarth and Jade Bolt will be covering every Monday for 5 weeks, while Angie Lunn is on a course. This ends after Easter.

Please can parents remember to give their child a healthy snack to bring with them.

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

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
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
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
