#### **Our Learning**

#### **Nursery/Reception:**

Our new topic this term is puddles and rainbows, we will be doing lots of puddle walks so please make sure your child has their wellies in school. Our story this week is Elmer, we will be doing lots of colourful crafts to create our own Elmer's.

#### Acorns (Years 1-2):

We have been busy learning about seasonal changes in science. We have learnt about animals during the different seasons and how the weather and day length changes. In year 1 maths, we have started our unit on addition and subtraction. In year 2, we are just starting on our multiplication and division unit of work. The children enjoyed learning how to use the jamming board on Times Tables Rockstars (TTS), they can find their login details on the cards I sent home in September. If you require a new copy, please ask. In literacy, we have started a new unit of work called 'look into space' we loved researching facts last week and look forward to our trip to Mars at Exeter Cathedral tomorrow (27th February 2024).

#### Lower Oaks (Years 3-4)

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Lower Oaks have started a new teaching sequence for literacy on 'Where my Wellies Take Me' by Clare and Michael Morpurgo. We went on a lovely walk through the woods, exploring quarries and splashing through puddles and streams. We will be going again this week so please can the children bring a change of clothes (particularly socks- because we were quite adventurous about the puddle paddling) and their wellies so we can go when the weather is good.

In Maths, we have been learning about measuring length using millimetres, centimetres, and kilometres and how to convert between the different measurements. Next week we will be moving onto perimeter and then to fractions.

The children have all completed a Star Quiz and updated ZPD ranges in their books (this is the range they should read between). I have also added their reading age in for information on the page next to this week's spellings.

#### **Upper Oaks (Years 5-6):**

This week upper oaks have been busy learning all about the language and symbol of ratio. We then applied our new skills to ratio problems.

In English we have started looking at a text called the extraordinary journey of ordinary things. We have learnt all about the long process needed to make chocolate from the pod on the tree to the bar in the shop. We have been practicing the skills needed to write an explanation text including using brackets and adverbs of time.

#### OOSC - Out of School Club with Angie Lunn

The children in OOSC have been thrilled to have the opportunity to access additional play with the new scooters and bikes. Therefore, most of the OOSC sessions have started and finished on the playground with the children spending long periods of time enjoying the new equipment.

Please note that Hayley Howarth and Jade Bolt will be doing every Monday for 5 weeks while Angie Lunn is on a course.

Please can parents remember to give their child a healthy snack to bring with them.

#### The Bookery Visit for World Book Day – Thursday 29th Feb (World Book Day - Thursday 7th March



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
