Our Learning

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Nursery/Reception:

Our topic this term is starry night, some of the things we will be learning about are nocturnal animals, the importance of a good night sleep and what happens in

☆ the world when we are sleeping. We will also be going out on some wellie walks.

Acorns (Years 1-2):

Acorns loved learning how to chop, slice, peel and mash different vegetables. They designed, made, ate and evaluated their own sandwiches. There are some 🖕 photos on Facebook. This term our topic is "Moon 🛧 Zoom" where we learn about the planets, famous \bigstar astronauts and space travel.

Lower Oaks (Years 3-4)

☆ Lower Oaks have started their year with some writing about this Christmas holiday. It has been lovely to hear what a good time everyone has had. The standard of writing is very high and all children have made ☆ significant progress from their starting points at the $\frac{1}{2}$ beginning of the year.

We are going to start our topic work on Allotments by \Rightarrow $\stackrel{\frown}{\Delta}$ looking at a non-fiction text called 'What a Waste' \overleftrightarrow looking at the impact of rubbish on our environment $\overrightarrow{}$ and how this links in with agriculture, food and packaging. ☆

In maths, this week we have been learning about area. Next week we are moving onto a teaching sequence on multiplication and division. In order for the children to be fluent with their recall of facts for calculation and fractions work it is essential that the children regularly practice recalling their times tables. Year 3 children need to know and have a fast recall of 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables by the end of the year. Year 4's need to know all facts up to 12 x 12. We suggest that the children can use TTR (every child has a login and their heat mat will give you a clear indication of which ones to work on), have their times table stuck on the wall or simply test them in the car as you are driving along.

Upper Oaks (Years 5-6):

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☆ ☆ In English, we have started looking at a book called "Where my wellies take me". We have put on our own wellies and have been out for some lovely winter walks in the local area.

In maths, we are starting to look at fractions.
