#### Acorns (Years 1-2):

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In Acorns, this term our topic is Bright Lights, Big City. We are focusing on London now and comparing it to 1666, when the Great Fire of London happened.

In science, we are learning about materials. In Maths over the next few weeks we will be covering shape and measure. Please keep reading at home, it is expected that the children will be reading for approx. 20 minutes a day outside of school, this is in addition to what we do in school. Please can the children bring in their favourite book on Wednesday this week so we can talk about them and create a new reading display, thank you.

#### **Lower Oaks (Years 3-4)**

Lower Oaks are going to be studying Greek Myths and Legends for our literacy.

For Maths, we are continuing to work on fractions and equivalent fractions of an amount.

#### **Upper Oaks (Years 5-6):**

This week in maths we are going to start looking at percentages. We will consolidating our learning on fractions and decimals and looking at how this relates to percentages.

Before going away on residential we were brushing up on our proof reading and editing skills. We had a look at some writing we did in the autumn term and discussed how we could make it even better to include all the grammar and punctuation we have learnt over the spring term. This week we are starting an exciting new narrative topic based on a short film. The film is called paraphernalia and we will be looking at how we can convey film techniques, such as lighting, in our writing.

#### OOSC - Out of School Club with Angie Lunn

The OOSC has been very quiet this week with most of key stage 2 being out on residential.

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However, this has allowed the children to play for longer on their favourite bikes and scooters.

The children have enjoyed arts and crafts with some children utilising the junk modelling box to make a variety of animals.



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

# Libby, by OverDrive



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Libby is a completely free book service. All you need is a library card. Libby can be downloaded as an app or used on a computer.

Once you have this you can download e-books and audiobooks, you have 14 days to read them and then they automatically return the book at the end of the 14 days (no late fees). Remember to go into the Juvenile section in the app for child appropriate books! Not all library books will be quizzable.

This can also be helpful for children who are wanting to read a book above their level, because they can have it read to them! Including the Book Club books.



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
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
