Nursery/Early Worlies

This Week at Early Worlies!

We have had a wonderfully autumnal week full of creativity, exploration and emotion awareness!

Pumpkin Art

The children loved getting messy and creative while making pumpkin-themed art. They explored colour, texture and shape, and developed their fine motor skills through painting, sticking and drawing.

Owls on Welly Wednesday


During Welly Wednesday, we headed outdoors and made our very own owls! We used natural materials and lots of imagination. The children enjoyed working together and practising their problem-solving as they constructed their creations.

Exploring Conker Shells

Our investigation area was full of curiosity this week as we explored conker shells. We talked about how they feel, looked closely at what was inside, and used lots of descriptive language. Some children even counted, sorted and compared sizes!

Feelings and Colours with The Colour Monster

We have been reading *The Colour Monster* and using it to help us label both colours and feelings. The children have been recognising emotions such as happy, sad, angry and calm, and matching them to colours in the story. We've had lovely discussions and supported the children in expressing how they feel.



Acorns - Reception, Year 1 & 2

Local Walk

Acorns went on a local history walk with Mrs Haughton to find out about our community. The children had the opportunity to talk with a Thatcher and see thatching reed up closer.

Reception

In maths, reception have been working hard on their 1-1 correspondence. This involves moving/touching one object at a time as they count reliably. In phonics, the children have been learnt the first set of sounds and are practising their blending skills to make different words as well as testing their skills on the computer on Giggling Graphemes – which they all really enjoyed. The children need daily practice of the sounds in their sound pots and to blend sounds together confidently, before they are ready to bring a book with words home.

The children have enjoyed learning about different emergency services and have loved drawing fires outside which they have then put out with water sprayer.

Years 1 and 2

In maths, we are nearing the end of our Place Value (within 20) uniting of work, we have spent time on learning about our teen numbers and also where numbers are placed on number lines. Our next unit of work will be about addition and subtraction.


In English, we have looked at a book about how we feel. We have then written a class book, which we have shared with other classes, and also written our own books. Next week we will start a new fiction unit about 'It's My Birthday'.

In phonics, we have learnt new ways of reading and writing the /ai/ grapheme and are now learning alternative ways of reading and writing the /ee/ grapheme.

Homework

Please ensure your child is reading daily at home. This should be 10 minutes for Reception and 20 minutes for Years 1 and 2. This is addition to any reading completed at school. Without daily reading at home children will fall behind. Reading is the priority because without reading, writing and accessing all other work becomes challenging.

After half term, I will start sending home a homework book with a short task in to be completed each week. It will be set on a Monday and needs to be returned on the Friday. Thank you for your support.



Lower Oaks

We have been looking at the text “Monster Slayer” and looking at superb setting and character descriptions. We are also writing our 500 word stories for the BBC 500 Word Competition following the recent visit from one of the Judges. Next we will be moving onto writing our own monster myths.

In Maths, we will be moving onto addition and subtraction.

Lower Oaks had a fantastic visit to the library at Chulmleigh College on Monday 29th September, these were some of the photos shared on Facebook below.



Upper Oaks

English: In Upper Oaks we are going to be starting a poetry unit. Using the skills that we learn, we are going to write poems about autumn and harvest.

Maths: We are going to be starting a new maths unit too. We are moving on to look at mental and written strategies of addition and subtraction.

All of Oaks

On Tuesday 30th September all of Oaks had a visit from a Judge of the BBC 500 Word Competition. She told us what the judges would be looking for in our stories and gave us some top tips for story writing.



Last week in science, Oaks were learning about day and night. They used torches, globes and footballs to act out how we get day and night.



Oaks had a lovely time at Wildwood Escot on Wednesday. The children spent most of the day in a Saxon village learning about Saxon life. We learnt about how the Saxons would have made bread and tools from wood and metal. We finished the day by meeting some of the animals that live at Escot and had a go on the drop slide!


