Mrs Burrow will be returning from her maternity leave in February, and she will resume teaching the Oak's topic work on Mondays. Mrs Pugsley will return to the teaching Acorns on a Monday from January and Mrs Heywood and Mrs Pinn will cover the Oaks until Mrs Burrow returns. We hope that this will ensure the best possible start to the term with familiar adults teaching the children to provide continuity.

This has been such a success that the team is expanding in January to include Abi, Danica and Josie to meet demand for places.

Thank you to the PTFA for all of their hard work and for all of the equipment and events they have funded. We have been lucky enough to have lots of enrichment opportunities for the children funded or provided by the PTFA and our amazing chairs this year – Jade and Freya with help from Colette. These have included a circus workshop, residential, several trips, interschool sports events and trips to the museum to mention just a few.

Thank you also to our volunteers who have come in to read or support us with events, such as Campie's 'Year-6 mince pie' event and the Halloween/World Book Day costume libraries etc.

Uniform

Mr. Payne has asked all of the schools to review uniform. 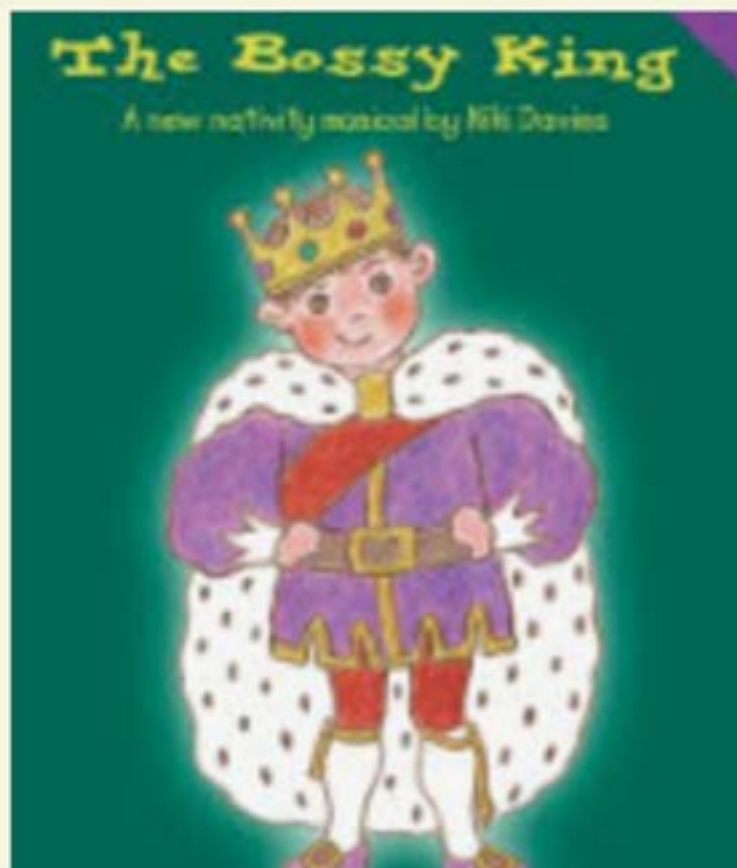
Our Elf has made a return this year and keeps the children guessing to where he will be each morning.

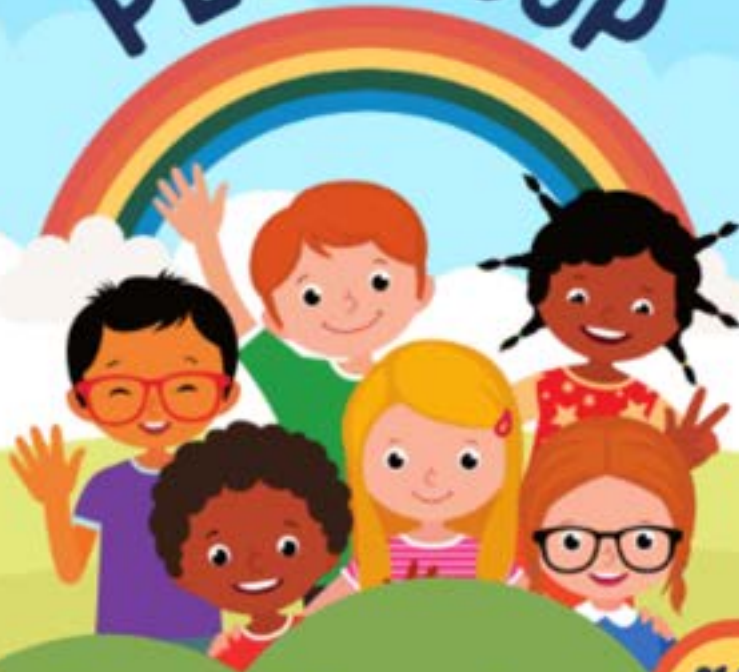
